



2021 SUMMER ACADEMIC INSTITUTE DUAL ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

During our modified Summer Academic Institute, **UCCS Pre-Collegiate will offer a limited number of VIRTUAL dual enrollment courses** to students who will be **Juniors** and **Seniors** during the 2021-2022 academic year. Each of these classes will be conducted fully remotely. Students have the option to select from the following three courses:

INOV 1010: THE INNOVATION PROCESS (3 credit hours)

Session Length: June 7 - July 2

Days: Monday - Friday

Times: 2:00-4:00PM MDT (time change)

Course Delivery: Remote, live sessions (MDT zone)

Course Description: Overviews the key components in the innovation process and examples of major innovations throughout history. Examines the interdisciplinary nature of innovation. Includes group exercises focused on improving team dynamics, brainstorming, conceptual-block busting, and other creative and problem-solving activities.

ANTH 1030: INTRODUCTION TO BIOLOGICAL ANTHROPOLOGY (3 credit hours)

Session Length: June 7 - July 2

Days: Tues., Wed., Thurs., Friday

Times: 2:00-4:00PM MDT

Course Delivery: Remote, live sessions (MDT zone)

Course Description: Evolution of humanity and its cultures from their beginnings through the early metal ages. Covers human evolution, race, prehistory, and the rise of early civilization.

COMM 1020: INTERPERSONAL COMMUNICATION (3 credit hours)

Session Length: June 14 - July 30

Days: Tuesday & Thursday

Times: 10:50AM – 1:30PM MDT

Course Delivery: Remote, live sessions (MDT zone)

Course Description: A lecture-discussion approach to communication theory and its applications in everyday communication. Intended to give students a point of view and certain basic knowledge that will help them become better communicators regardless of their fields of specialization.

DUAL ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

To ensure that students are prepared for the rigor of the UCCS dual enrollment courses, we are requiring students to complete an application to apply for dual enrollment this summer.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- In addition to instructional time with their professor, students should plan on spending nine hours per week to successfully complete and pass a dual enrollment course. A grade of C- or better is required to successfully earn credit for the course.
- Students who Withdraw from their course can expect to see the outcome of a “W” on their transcript.
- Due to the condensed nature of the summer courses, students who appear to be struggling at the end of the first week of classes will be advised to Withdraw from the course. **To successfully pass their dual enrollment course, students may not miss any live classes.**
- Depending on the district the student attends, there may be a cost associated with dual enrollment. There may be scholarships available for students who need them. More information on this will be available later on.
- If you are accepted to one of the dual enrollment courses, you will be invited to register for your dual enrollment course later this Spring. This dual enrollment process includes multiple steps. Pre-Collegiate staff will help guide you through these steps.
 - 1) Students will first complete the dual enrollment application (outlined in this letter).
 - 2) Once accepted, students will need to register for their course by completing the Online and Academic Outreach survey.
 - 3) Registered students will need to enroll in their selected dual enrollment course: INOV 1010, ANTH 1030, **or** COMM 1020.
- More information on the rest of Summer Academic Institute 2021, including non-credit workshops and opportunities, will be communicated in the coming weeks.

Applications are due Friday, April 16th. Students will receive notice whether they received a placement in their selected dual enrollment class by Monday, April 26th via email.
