What is Financial Aid?

Financial aid is money provided by the state and federal government to help you pay for college.

To see what you qualify to receive, you need to apply online every year, and then follow up with the RRCC Financial Aid Office to see if you need to turn in any additional paperwork. Most students at RRCC qualify for some type of financial aid, so we encourage you to apply if you are a US citizen or eligible non-citizen.

If you are an ASSET recipient, there is a separate application process. You can fill out the State Aid Application directly with the Financial Aid Office to see if you qualify for state funding. We encourage you to apply for scholarships as well!

Most types of financial aid require that you take at least 6 credits every semester.

How do I apply?

Every year, fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov.

There's also a mobile app you can download to your phone, called myStudentAid. The FAFSA comes out on October 1st for the following fall, spring, and summer semesters, and asks you about your and your family's income information from two years ago. If your income has been reduced since then, fill out the FAFSA as required and then talk to the Financial Aid Office about a "professional judgment request."

To send your FAFSA to RRCC, use our **school code: 009543**. The Financial Aid Office will receive your FAFSA about one week after you submit it online, and we will send you an email if we need any other information from you. You can also check the status of your financial aid file under the Financial Aid Requirements button in **The Rock** student portal at www.rrcc.edu. Once your file is complete, we will send you an offer email. You can also view your financial aid offer under the Financial Aid Award button in The Rock. Once you register for classes, you will be issued a **student email account**. Be sure to check that account regularly for important updates.

Federal Student Aid

Steps to Apply:

1. Complete the FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov. When you apply, you and your parent (if you are considered a dependent student) will need to create an FSA ID username and password so that you can sign the FAFSA and link your tax information directly to the FAFSA. If your parent does not have a Social Security number, they will print and mail the signature page at the end instead of creating an FSA ID.

- a. For help completing the FAFSA, email EOC@ccd.edu or call 303-352-TRIO to schedule a virtual appointment.

2. Follow up with the RRCC Financial Aid Office and submit any required documents.

3. Once you've been offered financial aid, read and accept the Terms and Conditions for receiving aid at RRCC in The Rock student portal.

4. View and accept your awards

- a. "Free" grant money is automatically accepted for you as long as your file is complete and you are registered for enough credits to qualify. Not everyone qualifies for grant funding.

When is the Deadline to Apply?

RRCC's priority deadline for the best types of aid is April 15th each year. However, we process FAFSAs all semester, so even if you miss the deadline you should still apply! Keep in mind the payment deadline for your classes is about two weeks after the semester begins, so we recommend you set up a payment plan under the Pay My Bill button in The Rock to avoid being charged late fees if you're still waiting for your financial aid to be processed when classes start. Even though the payment deadline comes before your financial aid pays, you don't have to worry - if your financial aid is enough to cover your balance, you won't be charged any late fees.

Types of Aid

There are two general types of financial aid you might be offered: gift aid, and self-help aid. When you complete the FAFSA, you are given an expected family contribution (EFC), and this number determines what types of financial aid you may receive. Grants and scholarships are a type of gift aid, which means you don't have to pay the money back as long as you successfully complete your courses and remain eligible for the funds. **Eligibility requirements** are listed on our website at www.rrcc.edu/finaid. All other types of aid are considered self-help aid because you either earn the funding by working on campus, or you have to pay the funding back shortly after you're no longer enrolled in at least 6 credits. Here is a breakdown of the types of aid you might be offered once your file is complete in our office:

► Grants

- *Grants are based on financial need.*

Your eligibility for grants is determined by your EFC. **You do not have to pay back grant funding** as long as you successfully complete your classes and remain eligible. The amount of grant money that pays into your school account is based on how many credits you are taking. If you will not be attending full time (12 or more credits during the semester), you can ask the RRCC Financial Aid Office how much grant money you will receive based on the number of credits you're taking. Not all students qualify for grants.

► Loans

- *Learn more about different types of aid, including student loans, at <https://studentaid.gov>*

To be eligible to borrow federal student loans, you must be enrolled in at least 6 credit hours. Repayment of student loans, with interest, begins 6 months after you are no longer enrolled in at least 6 credits. Some loans, called

subsidized loans, are interest-free until you are in repayment. **Unsubsidized** loans build interest as soon as they are paid to you. You don't need to make any payments until your registration falls below 6 credits. The US Department of Education (ED) has a lot of different repayment options to help you, including income-based repayment. When you borrow Federal Direct Stafford Loans, you are borrowing directly from ED at a fixed, low interest rate.

The very first time you borrow student loans, there will be a 30-day delay before your funds are released. You will also need to complete both Entrance Counseling and the Master Promissory Note (MPN) at <https://studentloans.gov> the first semester you borrow as an RRCC student. Loan payments are always split in half between two equal payments, usually over two semesters like fall and spring or spring and summer. Loans for just one semester will be paid in two payments at the beginning and the midpoint of the semester.

► Work-Study

- *Search for available jobs under the "Work-Study" link at www.rrcc.edu/finaid*

Get a job on campus and gain relevant work experience to build your resume now! Work-Study jobs pay every two weeks through direct deposit, and are flexible with your class schedule.

► Scholarships

- *Apply for RRCC scholarships at <https://rrcc.academicworks.com>*

Scholarships do not need to be repaid, and they require a separate application in addition to the FAFSA. Applications are typically available from November until the first week in March for the upcoming fall and spring semesters.

How do I get the money?

All types of financial aid, except work-study, will first **pay towards your tuition and fees balance** at the college. Funds are released the Monday after Census Date, about two weeks after the semester begins. If the amount of your financial aid is higher than the cost of your classes, you will be sent a **refund** through BankMobile. **To set up your refund preferences** with BankMobile, click on the BankMobile button in The Rock student portal at www.rrcc.edu. To use up to \$750 of your expected financial aid refund at the campus bookstore before funds are released, talk to the Financial Aid Office about submitting a **Bookstore Authorization form**.

How can I get in touch with Financial Aid if the campus is closed?

Schedule a virtual appointment with a Financial Aid Advisor by clicking on the Navigate button in The Rock and then clicking on "Get Assistance." You can also email financial.aid@rrcc.edu or call 303-914-6256. Financial aid can be a complicated process, so please never hesitate to reach out to us if you have any questions or concerns.

How to Apply

For **new, first-time students** at any CCCS college:

2. Review with your community college advisor to make sure your intended degree and program are eligible.

Encourage your students to visit regis.edu/freshmanapp to complete the **Regis First-Year Application**, or visit apply.commonapp.org to complete the Common Application. Regis University accepts the Common Application in lieu of its own application and gives equal consideration to both.

WHAT ELSE DO STUDENTS NEED TO APPLY?

- ▶ **Official high school transcript:** Documents must be official and may not be stamped “student copy.”
- ▶ **Essay:** Applicants are required to include a personal statement or essay with their application. This will allow the admissions committee to see how the student fits with Regis’ culture.
- ▶ **Letter of recommendation:** A letter of recommendation is not required but is encouraged.
- ▶ **Optional - Official ACT/SAT test scores:** We know our students are more than just a test score, which is why we already have a holistic approach to admissions decisions. First-year students who apply to Regis University will no longer be required to submit an ACT or SAT score for consideration as part of their application. Prospective students may submit standardized test scores, but those who feel their scores don’t fully reflect their academic skills may apply without them.

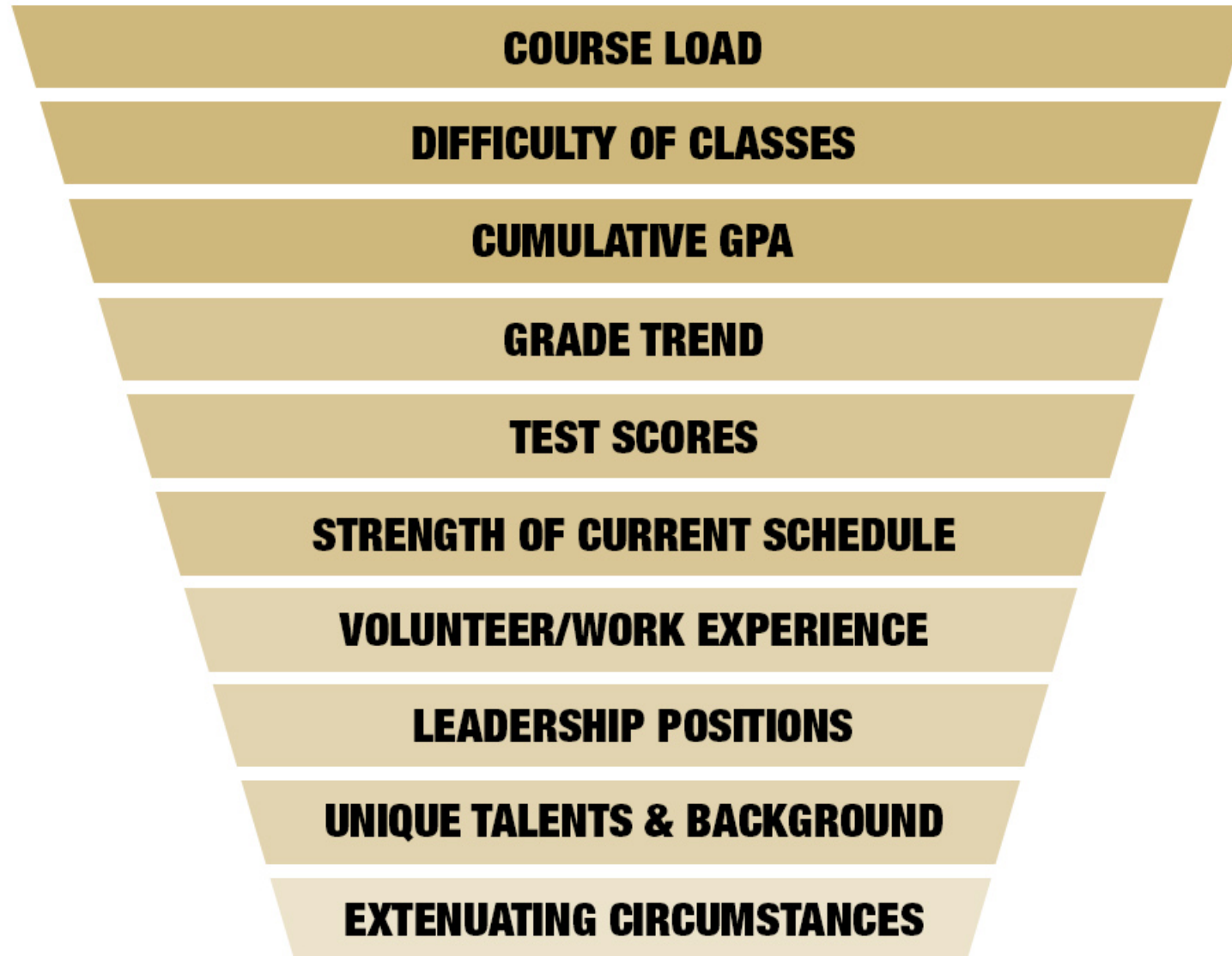

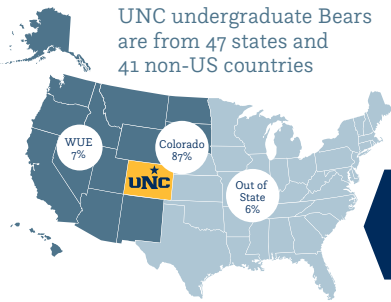

Information for Applicants

What is the Daniels Scholarship Program?

The Daniels Scholarship Program provides the opportunity for motivated students to earn a bachelor's degree that helps them build a successful life and career.

Daniels Scholars are honest, self-reliant, compassionate, proud Americans who value free enterprise and are prepared to give the world their best shot.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for the Daniels Scholarship Program, students must meet the following requirements at the time of application:

- Be a high school senior graduating from a school in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
- Be a resident of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
- Earn a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.0 in high school (on an unweighted 4.0 scale), **and** earn a minimum SAT Math score of 490 and a minimum Evidence-Based Reading & Writing score of 490, or a minimum ACT score of 18 in each category (writing score not required). Super scoring is not accepted.*

* Students who were unable to take the SAT or ACT due to COVID-19 cancellations are eligible to apply with a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.3 in high school (on an unweighted 4.0 scale), and do not need to provide standardized test scores.

- Meet financial eligibility requirement (see "Am I financially eligible?" on the reverse side)

What are the selection criteria?

Daniels Scholars are selected because they embody the criteria Bill Daniels defined for the program:

- Strength of character
- Leadership potential
- Commitment to serving their communities
- Academic performance or promise
- Well-rounded personality
- Emotional maturity and stability

How do I apply?

Applying for the Daniels Scholarship Program will take time, and cannot be completed at the last minute. Students are encouraged to register, gather the documents they will need to apply, and identify a reliable recommender as early as possible.

The completed application — plus all required supporting documents and a recommendation — must be submitted by the deadline.

Eligibility Questionnaire | The Eligibility Questionnaire determines general and financial eligibility, and requires information from the 2019 tax return filed by the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) claiming the applicant as a dependent.

Recommendation | Applicants must obtain a recommendation from a high school representative (principal, teacher, guidance counselor, coach, etc.) who is 21 or older and not related to the applicant. Recommendations are confidential and must be submitted via the online application system. Recommenders receive instructions by email once the student identifies them on their application. An application without a recommendation will not be considered, so students must ensure the recommender meets the submission deadline.

Submit Application | Applications and recommendations must be completed and submitted online at DanielsFund.org by Sunday, November 15, 2020 at 4:00 PM MST. Late, mailed, faxed, or emailed submissions will not be accepted. Required documentation includes: parent(s) or legal guardian(s) 2019 tax return, official high school transcript, official ACT/SAT scores (if available), proof of citizenship and residency, and proof of college enrollment for any additional claimed dependent(s).

Am I financially eligible?

In order to be eligible for the Daniels Scholarship Program, the applicant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must have an Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) of \$85,000 or less on the 2019 tax return on which the applicant is claimed as dependent (AGI appears on line 8b on the 2019 IRS Form 1040).

If there are additional dependents, beyond the applicant, claimed on this tax return, we allow for additional income as follows:

- \$5,000 for each additional dependent not in college
- \$15,000 for each additional dependent in college full-time during the 2020/21 academic year

The Eligibility Questionnaire determines general and financial eligibility, and requires information from the 2019 tax return filed by the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) claiming the applicant as a dependent. The Daniels Fund will ask applicants to upload a copy of their Student Aid Report (SAR) in December if more financial verification is necessary. The SAR is generated by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Students should complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after it opens on October 1.

Where can I use the scholarship?

Daniels Scholars may attend any two or four-year, nonprofit, accredited college or university in the United States. Scholars must intend to complete a bachelor's degree, and those starting at a two-year college must be on a path to earning a bachelor's degree. Daniels Scholarships may not be used at technical or trade schools, or for participation in certificate programs.

What does the scholarship cover?

The Daniels Scholarship is a college scholarship that pays toward the costs of:

- Tuition and fees
- Books and supplies
- Room and board
- Miscellaneous educational expenses

The Daniels Scholarship Program provides a four-year college scholarship that is unique to each student and varies depending on their Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and their choice of school and degree program. The scholarship pays up to \$25,000 per year toward the student's unmet need, after applying their EFC, other scholarships, grants, and financial aid. The Daniels Scholarship may be used to attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

Daniels Scholarships are annually renewable up to a maximum of four academic years (8 semesters or 12 quarters) if scholars meet all requirements of the Daniels Scholarship Program.

What are the benefits of the scholarship?

The Daniels Scholarship can cover most of the costs of earning a bachelor's degree, depending on factors such as the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC), other scholarships, and financial aid, as well as their choice of school and degree program:

- Financial assistance toward a four-year undergraduate degree
- Dedicated help and support from Daniels Fund staff and designated on-campus contacts
- Recognition as a Daniels Scholar
- Campus communities with events, activities, and support exclusively for Daniels Scholars
- An alumni program offering ongoing support and a lifelong connection to a network of alumni and current scholars
- A new laptop computer

What's expected of Daniels Scholars?

- Meet all academic requirements while in college (including a minimum 2.0 GPA), and remain on track to graduate with a bachelor's degree within four academic years
- Live on campus during freshman year
- Work in a paid position during the academic year (5 hours/week first year and 10 hours/week every year after)
- Complete the Daniels Scholarship Enrichment Program, a series of online workshops led by topical experts on subjects such as patriotism, civics, free enterprise, entrepreneurship, leadership, critical thinking, etiquette, financial literacy, and earning an ethics certification
- Follow the Daniels Scholar Code of Conduct at all times
- Communicate regularly with their Scholar Relations Officer
- Fulfill all scholarship requirements and submit required documents by their deadlines
- Participate in the Daniels Fund's new scholar orientation conference held in June

Once I apply, what happens next?

Applications and recommendations must be submitted online through the Daniels Fund website by the deadline.

The Daniels Fund will ask applicants to upload a copy of their Student Aid Report (SAR) in December if more financial verification is necessary.



In January, all applicants will be notified whether or not they have been selected as a finalist. The next step for finalists is a virtual interview conducted by local community leaders in February or early March. The new class of Daniels Scholars is announced in late March.
